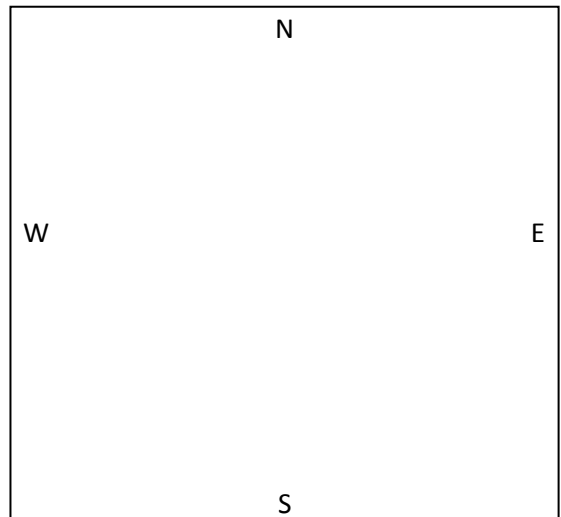

APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL TO CONDUCT OPEN BURNING OF PEAT

The approval for an open peat burning application is dependent upon the evaluation by the county of the potential environmental impacts and effects on the public safety. This approval can be withdrawn or application can be denied if the Westlock County deems such action necessary in the public interest. Please note that Westlock County also has the authority to defer or suspend open peat burning if it is creating a nuisance or hazard. A permit from the local fire authority will also be required prior to the burning of peat

By completing the following checklist, you will be able to determine if your application for approval of open peat burning meets the regulatory conditions established in Westlock County Bylaw No. 05-2015 Fire Protection Bylaw.

This checklist is provided to save you time and unnecessary expense.

- 1. Peat windrow /pile more than 24 months old?
- 2. Pile less than (75) feet diameter and all within 500 feet of each other?
- 3. Windrow less than (75) feet Wide (250) feet Long (20) feet High?
- 4. Is the burn setback (100) feet or more from wild lands, brush or combustible structures?
- 5. Will the burn be supervised at all times by a competent person who has the means available to quickly extinguish the fire?
- 6. Windrows/Piles (1) mile or more from numbered HWY?
- 7. Windrows/Piles (100) feet or more from an intersection?
- 8. Windrows/Piles (100) feet or more from County road?
- 9. Windrows/Piles (500) feet or more from a dwelling or occupied farm yard?

These are the major guidelines used in the inspection of a proposed burn site. **A negative answer** to any of the preceding questions may result in the denial of your application. **Please provide the information comments on the back of this application.** This is to certify that I will comply with the regulatory conditions for peat burning as identified in the above checklist.
